

## A Day In The Life – The Beatles

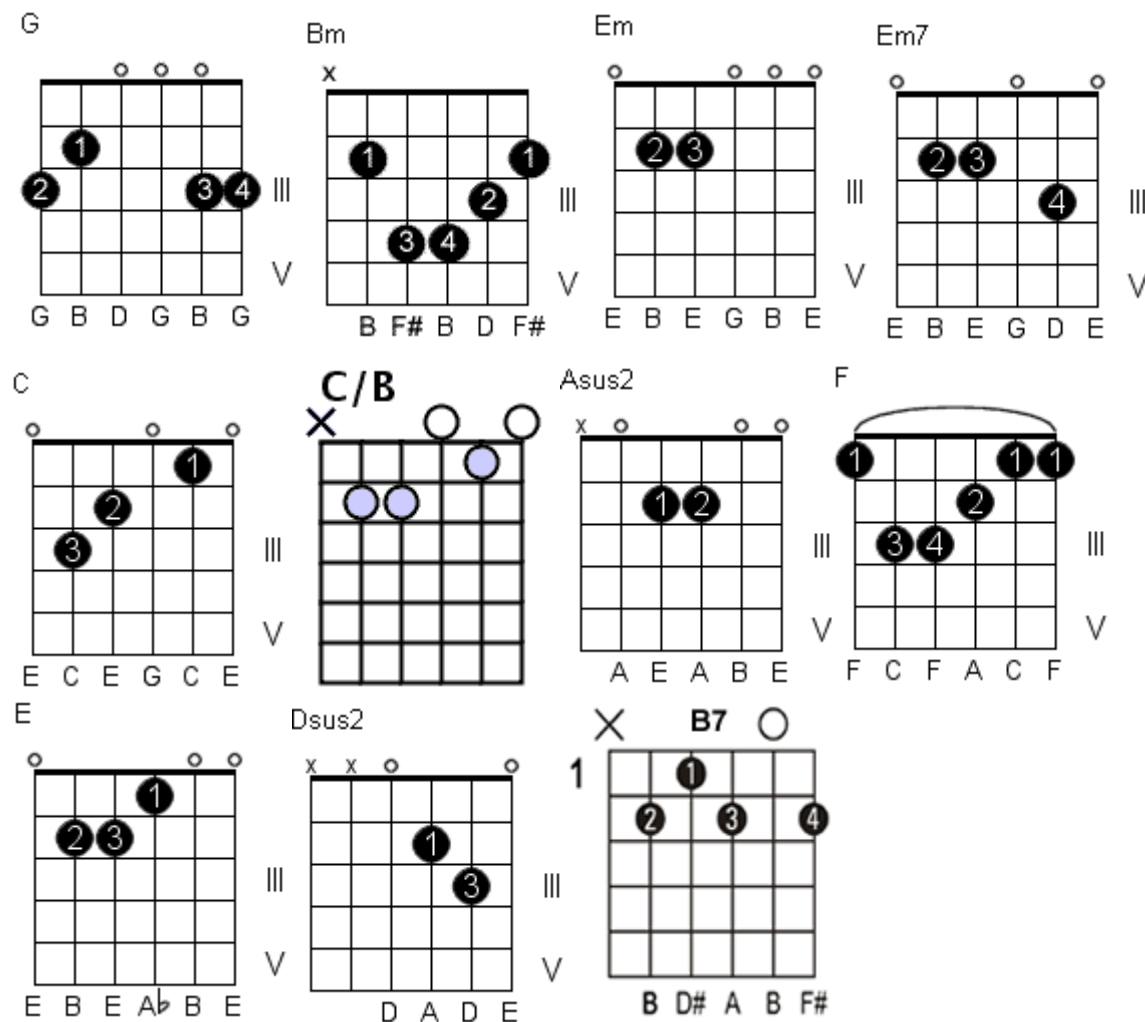
Tempo: NA

Strumming Pattern: DDD, DU (for the main theme)

When you get to the chord change to E, you'll need to strum like this: DU, UDUD

This is one of those songs that everything is pretty easy until you get to the change. I couldn't use a click-track because my click track only works in basically 4/4 time. I CAN change it, but it would require me to change it mid-song, which is relatively impossible.
